

College Readiness Checklist: Students with Disabilities

Self-Advocacy:

- I can explain my disability and how it impacts me to someone who doesn't know me
- I know the names of my medical providers, therapists, etc.
- I feel comfortable asking questions if I do not understand something
- I actively participate in my IEP/504 meetings
- I am able to independently make a phone call and send an email to a working professional
- I have copies of my disability documentation that I can provide as needed (IEP, 504 Plan, DVR Assessments, Medical Records, etc.)
- I have multiple support people I feel comfortable going to if I am struggling

Academic Readiness:

- I have time management strategies that support studying, getting homework submitted on time, and showing up for class on time
- I have taken a class while only using college approved accommodations
- I have explored program options to ensure what I choose meets my interests, aptitudes, and abilities.
- I have taken classes that relate to my chosen program of study (i.e. science classes for healthcare programs)
- I have taken the ACT or Accuplacer

MPTC Connections

- I have met with a recruiter to complete admissions steps
- I have completed the FAFSA application and/or met with an MPTC Financial Aid Specialist to ask any questions
- I have submitted an Initial Accommodation Request and provided disability documentation
- I have met with an Accommodation Specialist to discuss my disability, what to expect in college, and begin developing an accommodation plan
- I have received training on all Assistive Technology I plan to use in college and feel comfortable using it
- I know how to access my student email, myMPTCstudent, and Canvas
- I have met with my Academic Advisor for Program Orientation and to register for classes
- I have toured campus (if attending in-person classes)
- I have connected with other campus resources that I may need
 - Counseling
 - Veteran
 - Financial Aid
 - Student Success Center
 - Services
 - Student Life
 - Peer Tutoring
 - Diversity Relations
 - EDGE/TRIO
- I have connected with other community resources that I may need
 - County Social Services
 - Food and Housing Assistance
